

VisionSpring Foundation (VSF) Activity Report: 1st April 2026 to 30th June 2026

Mission

To provide eye-screening, primary eye-care services, and eye-health advice to the people at the bottom of the socio-economic pyramid.

Current Scenario

According to the World Health Organization (WHO) estimates, more than 700 million people in the developing world struggle with poor life quality due to bad eyesight. It is estimated that uncorrected vision results in \$227 billion in lost productivity to the global economy. In India alone, an estimated 550 million (55 Crore) people require eyeglasses for vision correction. Blurry vision compromises one's ability to work effectively, to read and learn in school, and to navigate surroundings with ease and safety. For many living in developing countries suffering from vision loss, a pair of eyeglasses could mean the difference between opportunity and loss of income and quality of life.

Activities

VisionSpring Foundation (VSF) is an NGO (not-for-profit) that does eye-screening for the poor people, provides primary eye-care services, and eye health advice with FCRA Registration Number: 231661855. VSF also has the facility of providing eyeglasses to those who need them. VSF conducts community outreach activities and free eye-screening outreach program. The mobile eyecare units (vans) go to the remote interiors and provide last mile vision-care services to the poor. VSF also provides eye-care/eye-health advice centres and refers patients with complex eye diseases (such as cataract, etc.) to the nearest eye hospital. VSF helps change the lives of the poor people in India by aiding in restoring their vision.

Program(s) Undertaken between 1st April 2026 to 30th June 2026:

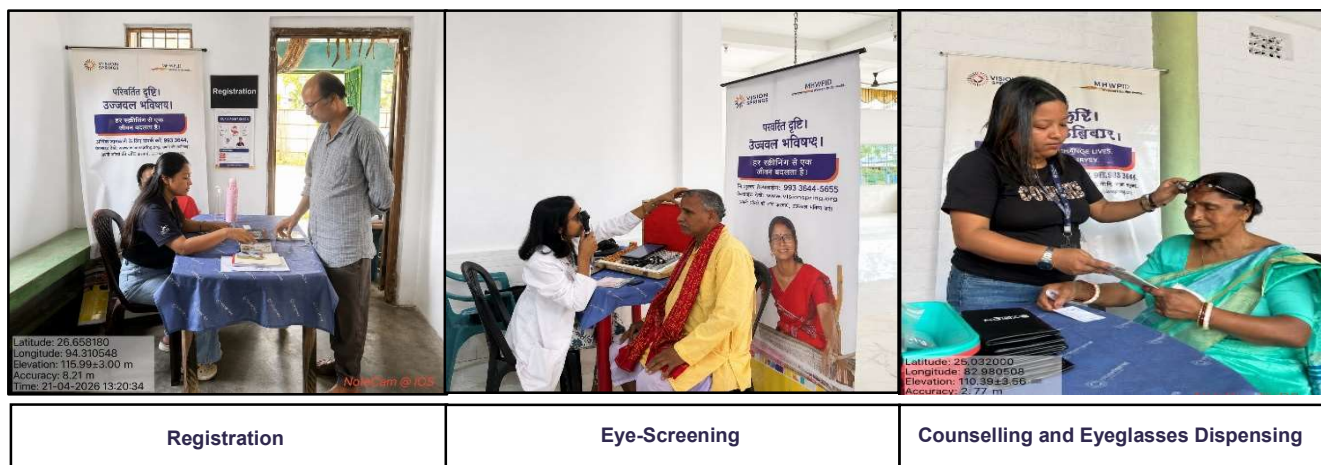
A. Improving the lives and productivity of tea estate workers, weavers, artisans, and associated communities in Jorhat, Assam, India, through eye-screenings and provision of eyeglasses.

During the period, 1st April 2026 to 30th June 2026, a total of 1,650 tea estate workers, weavers, artisans, and associated communities were screened for vision in the tea estates and the weaver and artisan clusters of Jorhat in Assam, India, and eyeglasses were distributed to those who required them. Those with complex eye diseases were referred to the district hospital in the area for further diagnosis and treatment. This program was in collaboration with the organisation, Srishti, in Jorhat, Assam, India.

Eye-Screening Statistics: 1st April 2026 to 30th June 2026

- 1. Distribution of people screened:** Screened a total of 1,650 tea estate workers, weavers, artisans, and associated communities in Jorhat, Assam, India, among them 43% (n = 705) were males and 57% (n = 945) were females.
- 2. Refractive error (poor vision) rate among the screened population:** 62% (n = 1,026) of all the screened individuals identified with refractive error/presbyopia.
- 3. Referrals made for the screened population:** 18% (n = 291) have been referred to the hospitals out of whom 80% (n = 233) identified with suspected cataract and 20% (n = 58) identified with other complex eye diseases had been referred for further diagnosis to tertiary care hospitals and/or community health centres.
- 4. Eyeglasses distribution:** 84% (n = 860) of all population identified with refractive error/presbyopia received eyeglasses; Reading Glasses: 55% (n = 471), Prescription Glasses: 38% (n = 325), Pre-cuts: 7% (n = 64).
- 5. First Time Wearers (FTWs):** 93% (n = 802) of the people who received their eyeglasses got their first ever pair of eyeglasses through the eye-screening outreach program.
- 6. Post-coverage rate** in the population was 84%.

For over 15 years, Nani Saikia has been working as a tailor. Her craft requires precision-threading needles, cutting straight lines, and focusing on fine details every day. When she heard about eye-screening outreach program through the community announcement, she didn't wait. She immediately registered herself for a vision check. At the program, Nani was diagnosed and provided with a pair of prescription eyeglasses. Today, she says she can see clearly again, just like before. "The struggles I faced while threading a needle or seeing cutting lines are gone," she shares. "I expect to work faster and more productively now." Inspired by her own experience, Nani is also encouraging others in her community to visit the outreach program and get the same benefit she received.



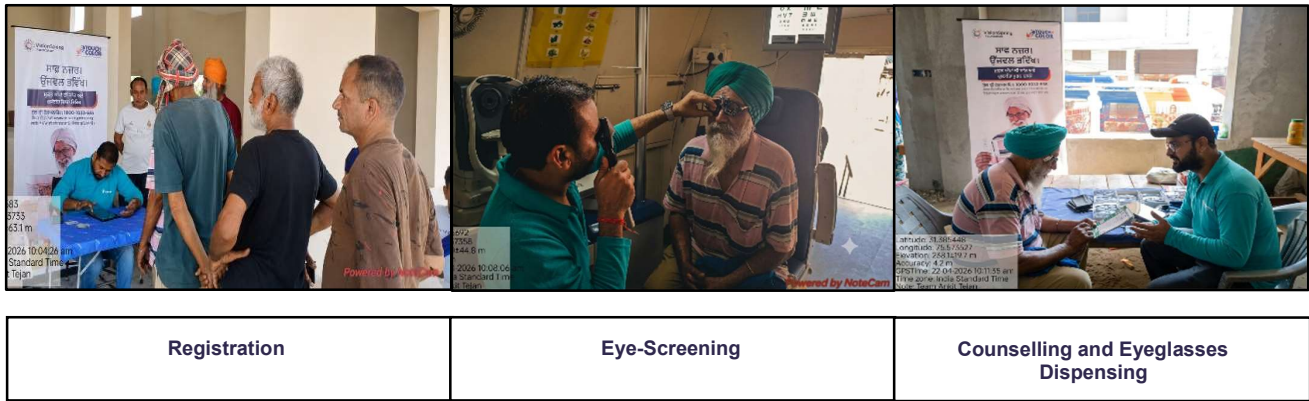
B. Improving the lives and productivity of community members in Jalandhar in Punjab, India, through eye-screenings and provision of eyeglasses.

During the period, 1st April 2026 to 30th June 2026, a total of 1,504 community members were screened in Jalandhar in Punjab, India, and eyeglasses were provided to those who required them. Those with complex eye diseases were referred to the district hospital in the area for further diagnosis and treatment. This program was a part of the Clear Vision Punjab initiative.

Eye-Screening Statistics: 1st April 2026 to 30th June 2026

- 1. Distribution of people screened:** Screened a total of 1,504 community members in Punjab, India, among them 38% (n = 566) were males and 62% (n = 938) were females.
- 2. Refractive error (poor vision) rate among the screened population:** 77% (n = 1,151) of all the screened individuals identified with refractive error/presbyopia.
- 3. Referrals made for the screened population:** 12% (n = 173) have been referred to the hospitals out of whom 55% (n = 96) identified with suspected cataract and 45% (n = 77) identified with other complex eye diseases had been referred for further diagnosis to tertiary care hospitals and/or community health centres.
- 4. Eyeglasses distribution:** 83% (n = 960) of all population identified with refractive error/presbyopia received eyeglasses; Reading Glasses: 63% (n = 604) and Prescription (Rx) Glasses: 34% (n = 331) and Pre-Cuts: 3% (n = 25).
- 5. First Time Wearers (FTWs):** 95% (n = 915) of the people who received their eyeglasses got their first ever pair of eyeglasses through the eye-screening outreach program.
- 6. Post-coverage rate** in the population was 83%.

Reena, a homemaker from Jalandhar, first learned about eye-screening outreach program through a community announcement. Encouraged by the initiative, she invited her neighbor to attend outreach program with her. At the outreach program, Reena received a thorough eye check-up and was provided with a pair of prescription eyeglasses. "I can now see near objects clearly," Reena shares. "Tasks that used to be very difficult for me are now much easier." She feels fortunate that the outreach program was organised right in her community. "We didn't have to travel far. The team came to us and provided excellent service," she says. Reena thanks the entire team for bringing vision care to her doorstep and helping her get back to her daily work with ease.



C. Improving the lives and productivity of factory workers through eye-screening and provision of eyeglasses

During the period, 1st April 2026 to 30th June 2026, a total of 1,835 factory workers were screened in the factories in Gurugram, Haryana, India. 1,208 factory workers received eyeglasses. Those with complex eye diseases were referred to the district hospital in the area for further diagnosis and treatment.

Eye-Screening Statistics: 1st April 2026 to 30th June 2026

- 1. Distribution of people screened:** Screened a total of 1,835 factory workers in Haryana, India, among them 93% (n = 1,698) were males and 7% (n = 137) were females.
- 2. Refractive error (poor vision) rate among the screened population:** 66% (n = 1,216) of all the screened individuals identified with presbyopia.
- 3. Referrals made for the screened population:** 5% (n = 94) have been referred to the hospitals out of whom 11% (n = 10) identified with suspected cataract and 89% (n = 84) identified with other complex eye diseases had been referred for further diagnosis to tertiary care hospitals and/or community health centres.
- 4. Eyeglasses distribution:** 99% (n = 1,208) of all population identified with presbyopia received eyeglasses; Reading Glasses: 52% (n = 626), Prescription (Rx) Glasses: 42% (n = 503) and Precut: 7% (n = 79).
- 5. First Time Wearers (FTWs):** 81% (n = 976) of the people who received their eyeglasses got their first ever pair of eyeglasses through the eye-screening outreach program.
- 6. Post-coverage rate** in the population was 99%.

Ibrahim has been working as a tailor for many years. Due to long hours at the machine, he began facing serious challenges, especially with threading needles and frequent headaches. After attending the eye-screening outreach program, Ibrahim received a pair of eyeglasses. "Now I can see everything clearly," Ibrahim says. "The problems I faced while threading the needle are a thing of the past, and I no longer get headaches after working for long hours." He is grateful to the team not only for the eyeglasses, but also for guiding him on how to care for them and for sharing information that can help improve eyesight.



D. Improving the lives and educational outcomes of children through the provision of eyeglasses.

During the period, 1st April 2026 till 30th June 2026, VSF conducted eye-screening and provided eyeglasses to those who require them in Punjab, India. VSF conducted eye-screenings of 1,313 children and provided 155 eyeglasses from 1st April 2026 till 30th June 2026. These eyeglasses helped children see clearly and improved learning outcomes as 70% of learning is through vision. It helps children to actively participate in school and would contribute to making their future bright.

Eye-Screening Statistics: 1st April 2026 to 30th June 2026

- 1. Distribution of children screened:** Screened 1,313 children in Punjab, India.
- 2. Eyeglasses distribution:** 155 eyeglasses were distributed to children who have refractive error.
- 3. First Time Wearers (FTWs):** Out of 155 eyeglasses distributed to the children, 137 were the first-time eyeglasses wearers.

Lapreet was having difficulty seeing the blackboard from a distance and often found the writing blurry during class. At times, she felt shy and self-conscious about wearing glasses, worrying about what her peers and classmates might think. During an outreach program at her school, the VSF team conducted a complete and comprehensive eye examination, which revealed a slight change in her prescription. With her new eyeglasses, she can now see the blackboard clearly and follow her lessons with greater ease. More importantly, her glasses have given her renewed confidence.



E. Ensuring road safety and wellbeing of Commercial and Heavy Motor Vehicle (HMV) drivers in the state of Punjab, Bengaluru, Haryana, Rajasthan, Assam, and Delhi NCR in India through eye-screenings and provision of eyeglasses.

During the period of 1st January 2026 till 30th June 2026, a total of 12,563 commercial drivers and allied transport workers were screened at Bus Stand, Auto Stand, Highway passing areas, Corporate offices parking's, RTO Office, Commercial vehicle parking in the districts of Gautam Budh Nagar (Noida), Agra (Uttar Pradesh), Biswanath, Kokrajhar, and Baksa (Assam), Jalandhar (Punjab), Bengaluru (Karnataka), Darjeeling (West Bengal), and 6,602 eyeglasses were provided to those who required them. Those with complex eye diseases were referred to the Government/other hospitals for further diagnosis and treatment.

Eye-Screening Statistics: 1st April 2026 to 30th June 2026

- Distribution of people screened:** Screened a total of 12,563 commercial drivers and allied transport workers were screened at Bus Stand, Auto Stand, Highway passing areas, Corporate offices parking's, RTO Office, Commercial vehicle parking in the districts of Gautam Budh Nagar (Noida), Agra (Uttar Pradesh), Biswanath, Kokrajhar, and Baksa (Assam), Jalandhar (Punjab), Bengaluru (Karnataka), Darjeeling (West Bengal).
- Refractive error (poor vision) rate among the screened population:** 63.7% (n = 8,007) of all the screened individuals identified with refractive error/presbyopia.
- Referrals made for the screened population:** 7.5% (n = 951) have been identified with suspected cataract, 1.96 % (n = 247) have been identified with other eye conditions and 0.4% (n = 51) have been identified with eye infections and referred for further diagnosis to tertiary care hospitals and/or community health centres.
- Eyeglasses distribution:** 82.45% (n = 6,602) of all population identified with refractive error/presbyopia received eyeglasses; Reading Glasses: 65.8% (n = 4,347), Pre-cuts: 4.5% (n = 299) and Prescription (Rx) Glasses: 29.6% (n = 1,956).

5. **First Time Wearers (FTWs):** 97.8% (n = 6,457) of the people who received their eyeglasses got their first ever pair of eyeglasses through the eye-screening outreach program.

Subhash Singh has spent years transporting goods across long distances in Assam. Like many commercial drivers, he gradually developed difficulty seeing nearby objects clearly. Reading transport documents, checking mobile messages, and reviewing delivery details became increasingly challenging, affecting both his efficiency and confidence at work. During vision screening outreach program, he underwent a comprehensive eye examination. The screening identified presbyopia, a common age-related vision condition that can be easily corrected with reading glasses. He was immediately provided with a pair of reading glasses tailored to his needs. The impact was immediate. For the first time in years, he could comfortably read documents and view small text without strain. With improved near vision, he now feels more confident performing daily tasks that are essential for safe and efficient driving.
